



Training

Our training occurs in two blocks: from February to July and from September to November.

During these periods we train on Tuesday nights between 8.00 and 10.00 pm.

We complete a 2 week full time training period in July, and a 1 week full time training period in November.

We also train over approx. 5 weekends during the year. Outside of this, members have the opportunity to complete career courses at Brigade or with one of the Army schools.

Commitment is voluntary and allowances are made for exams and civilian employment.

We regularly conduct live firing exercises and all members train on and fire a variety of other weapons and learn to operate a range of technical equipment.

Members are paid for periods of full time training, and are compensated for regular Tuesday night training with a gratuity paid once each year.

Age Limits.

Females and Males aged between 17 and 35 years are eligible to apply for enlistment.

Applying for enlistment

Application Form. Potential recruits must complete and sign a form providing basic personal details.

Security Clearance. All applicants must be security cleared. This process can take a number of weeks to complete. In the event that an applicant is deemed to be unsuitable, we are not given any details.

Medical Examination. Applicants must also undergo a routine medical examination. While there is no physical fitness test prior to enlistment, applicants must be in good physical condition.

Attestation. Once the above have been completed applicants can be attested. Then issued with an army number and clothing prior to joining a Recruit Training course.

Applicants can attend induction training while their application is being processed.
